CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
ARTICLE X, SECTION 19
(INITIATIVE)

Florida Transportation Initiative for statewide high speed monorail, fixed guideway or magnetic levitation system. To reduce traffic and increase travel alternatives, this amendment provides for development of a high speed monorail, fixed

guideway or magnetic levitation system linking Florida's five largest urban areas and providing for access to existing air and ground transportation facilities and services by directing the state and/or state authorized private entity to implement the financing, acquisition of right-of-way, design, construction and operation of the system, with construction beginning by November 1, 2003.
